Charges

The Current charges for the use of site and facilities are as follows: -

S.W.Scotland Region Scouts: - £ 2.50 per camper/night
Other Campers: - £ 3.00 per camper/night

Hot water: -in toilets - 20p coin meters
Showers - 20p coin meters
Dish washing - 50p coin meter
Tumble drier - £1 coin meter

Requests for dates, verbal or written must be confirmed within 14 days, using the booking form attached, after which time they may not be honoured.

Groups requiring sole use of the site should contact the Booking Secretary for details of charges.

Calculation of Bills

Charges are for all users of the Camp Site, per day, or part thereof.

For weekend camps, the 'day' is taken from 5.00 pm -> 5.00 pm.
For longer camps, it is from 12.00 noon -> 12.00 noon.

A non-returnable deposit of £10.00 is required with all bookings. This will be set against camp fees.

No bookings will be accepted without a deposit.

Confirmation of booking and receipt of deposit will be acknowledged via email to the address, if any, provided on the booking form.

(Please enclose a S.A.E. if a receipt is required for deposit and no email address is given.)

Guidance for Campers

Arrival / Departure

Groups making use of the campsite for summer camps are asked to make their travel arrangements such that, where possible, they arrive after 2.00 pm and depart before 12.00 noon.

Time of arrival should be as given in booking form.

Access for advanced parties by prior arrangement with the Warden.

Any changes in arrival / departure times, from those stated on your booking form, should be communicated to the Warden in good time.

On arrival the leader in charge should report to the duty Warden.

On departure, prior to vacating the site, campers should request a site inspection by the Warden.

Fires

Cooking on open fires may only be carried out on altar fires. Firewood is normally available from the wood store but will possibly need to be cut by campers using their own saws. There is a Saw Horse.

There is also a local sawmill, which can usually provide cut firewood for a reasonable charge. Own transport is required.

Surplus wood should be returned to the wood store at the end of your camp. Please try to keep the wood store tidy at all times.

Ashes from altar fires should be tipped in the allocated spot. Please try to ensure that no unburnt rubbish is tipped.

After use, altar fires should be returned to the storage area in a clean condition and stacked tidily.

Cutting of trees is **forbidden**. The use of axes is strongly discouraged except for splitting firewood at the wood store area. Where use of an axe is necessary, it should be under the direct supervision of a Leader.

Toilets etc

Leaders are responsible for ensuring that the toilet block, and kitchen facility if in use, are cleaned thoroughly at least once each day. Materials for doing this are provided. Where the facilities are shared, between more than one camping group, leaders should arrange a rota system.

Water

The taps around the site are for the drawing of fresh water only. The field drains get easily blocked if foodstuffs are washed down them. The small site kitchen provides facilities for food preparation and washing up. There are two fridge freezers in the kitchen and a washing machine & tumble dryer. It is not intended as a “Camp Kitchen”. The toilet block provides all facilities for ablutions. Drinking water should not be drawn from the tap at the chemical toilet disposal point.

Waste Disposal

We are sorry but **no** wet or dry pits may be dug. (NTS property) Where possible, dry rubbish should be burnt and any cans flattened then put into black rubbish bags. These should be tied and left at the collection point. Chemical toilets, if used, can be emptied at the disposal point behind the toilet block.

Pioneering

Pioneering timbers are available.

No timbers may be cut. (A variety of sizes are available.) Please do not use trees as anchorages or attach ropes to them. After use, timbers should be returned to the store and left in a tidy state. Any damage should be reported to the Warden or his deputy. Turf damaged during construction of projects should be repaired.

Culzean Country Park

The facilities of the Country Park, but not the Castle itself, are available free of charge to groups using the Camp Site. It is possible sometimes to arrange a free tour of the castle for a uniformed group but this is not guaranteed. Scouts-Scotland hold an NTS permit which can be obtained from SHQ on request (www.scouts-scotland.org.uk)

A Ranger service is available but please make bookings by contacting the Ranger Service in advance of your arrival at the site. You will be asked for a donation to the NTS in return for services of the Rangers.

Campers should not venture into Culzean Country Park unless supervised by a Leader. Each person should wear some group identification, e.g. neckie, sweatshirt, etc. The grounds are extensive and are excellent for orienteering, treasure hunts, nature rambles, beach/shore walks etc. Wide games are possible but should be of a quiet or restrained nature and must not interfere with or annoy other users of the park.

The main gate to the site should be kept shut at all times. The gate and the style beside it are the only entrance to/exit from the site. Boundary fences should not be crossed.

Leaders are asked to respect the Opening Hours of the Country Park, displayed at the Paybox and not venture down to the Castle / Visitors' Centre after dark. The park closes to the public at dusk.

General

Modern tents with sewn in groundsheets cause serious problems of ground maintenance. Tents with sewn-in groundsheets should be moved every 2 or 3 days. Ground under canvas with removable groundsheets should be aired daily whenever practical.

All vehicles must be parked in the Car Park.

No dogs, other than guide dogs, are allowed onto the site unless by special arrangement.
